- Students should **choose any two subjects** from any **two combinations as Major Subjects** and choose the **third subject** from the other remaining Combinations as **Minor Subject.**
- Students should be very careful in choosing the **two Major Subjects** and **one Minor Subject.**

INTER-DISCIPLINARY COURSES (IDC):

All UG students are required to undergo 3-introductory level courses relating to any of the BROAD DISCIPLINES. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses undergone at the Higher Secondary Level (12th) class under this category. A student **cannot study IDC's from the same broad discipline.**

ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSES (AEC)

- **Single Major and Single Minor Course:** Compulsory English to be studied in 2nd Semester and one from MIL Nepali or Alternative English to be studied in the 3rd Semester.
- Three Discipline Specific Courses (Multidisciplinary):
 Compulsory English to be studied in 3rd Semester and one from MIL Nepali or Alternative English to be studied in the 2nd Semester.

VALUE ADDED COURSES (VAC)

- **Single Major and Single Minor Course:** Environmental Education to be studied in 1st Semester and Understanding India to be studied in the 4th Semester.
- Three Discipline Specific Courses (Multidisciplinary): Environmental Education to be studied in 4th Semester and Understanding India to be studied in the 1st Semester.

SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC): These courses (three in number) may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

INTERNSHIP: A student will have to undergo internship once either at the end of 2nd Semester or at the end of 4th Semester during vacations.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Single Major and Single Minor course: % of Marks

A student shall be allowed to take admission in the single major and single Minor course of B.A/B.Com/BCA. if she has passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject in the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination which is recognized by the university as equivalent thereto.

Provided that a candidate who has obtained-

- (a) 55% marks in the aggregate,
- or
- (b) 50% in the aggregate with 60% marks in a subject / related subject in the last qualifying Examination shall be eligible to apply for Single Major and Single Minor course in that subject.

Admission shall however be on merit and availability of seats. Provided that for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PWD candidates - the minimum marks for eligibility shall be as per Rules of the State Government.

Provided further that in matter of eligibility 54.5% marks or above shall be equal to 55%, 49.5% and above shall be equal to 50% and 59.5 marks or above shall be equal to 60%.

Three Discipline Specific Courses (Multidisciplinary):

A student shall be allowed to take admission in the Multidisciplinary course of B.A if she has passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject in the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination which is recognized by the university as equivalent thereto.

A candidate shall be allowed to pursue B.A Multidisciplinary course if she has passed the qualifying Examination in Vocational Stream subjects. Such students shall have the option to study up to the end of 6^{th} Semester.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Choice of Major/Minor Courses for Single Major & Single Minor and Three Discipline specific Multidisciplinary courses:

- 1. A candidate will be allowed to take up Sociology or Education or BCA if she has passed in the previous qualifying examination of any stream.
- 2. A candidate will be allowed to take up B.Com. if she has studied Science subjects along with Mathematics in the previous qualifying exams.
- 3. Candidates from Arts Stream are not allowed to apply in B.Com.
- 4. Candidates from any stream may apply in B.C.A.
- 5. A candidate will be allowed to take up Geography subject if she has passed in Geography at the qualifying examination.
- 6. A candidate pursuing Major in a subject will not be allowed to take up the same subject as Minor.
- 7. While taking Major and Minor subjects, availability of the said subjects in the concerned Colleges will be taken into cognizance.
- 8. Self-attested copies of mark sheets must be attached along with the form. Incomplete form will be rejected.
- 9. Admission of a candidate will be cancelled if any of the statement is found incorrect or incomplete.
- 10. All notice regarding admissions will be displayed in the college Notice Board and also will be available in the college website: (www.clunycollege.ac.in)

OTHER REGULATIONS

Reservation of Seats: There will be reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC/EWS/Differently-Abled Candidates as per Government Rules. For differently-abled candidates' minimum disability at least 40% will be considered.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

TERMINATION

If a student newly admitted to the first semester remains absent from attending classes for **more than the first 15 days continuously without any intimation**, his/her/transgender admission will stand cancelled.

COMPLETION OF UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES OF THE UNIVERSITY

A 3 Year undergraduate program has to be completed within a span of 5 year from the year of admission. A 4 Year undergraduate program has to be completed within a span of 7 year from the year of admission.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission to all courses starts after the publication of the results of the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education. Admission is made strictly on the basis of merit (performance in the last public examination).

N.B.:

- 1. Incomplete forms will be rejected
- 2. The College Authority reserves the right to cancel any application / admission
- 3. The candidate must agree to abide by the rules and code of discipline of the North Bengal University and Cluny Women's College. She must affirm that the information furnished in the filled-in form is true to the best of her knowledge.

REGISTRATION

After admission to the College, a student has to get registered with the University of North Bengal. If the concerned student is from a Board other than the W.B.C.H.S.E., she has to get provisionally registered and should submit the <u>Migration Certificate</u> at the earliest. The College will not be responsible in any case for the cancellation and /or rejection of a student's registration.

FACILITIES

LIBRARY

The college has a library for the use of students and members of the staff.

After admission, a student has to produce her fee receipt to the librarian for collecting the library card within the notified time.

LIBRARY SERVICE

The college library provides the following services to optimize the utilization of the reading materials held in the library collection.

- 1. Reference service
- 2. E-Library for student and teachers for research with inflibnet facility.
- 3. An open access system for the student in the central reading room.
- 4. Display of daily newspapers on the reading desk.
- 5. Provision of using journals and periodicals on requirement. The Library is kept open throughout the year except on public holidays and long vacation.

DEPARTMENT LIBRARY

Each Department has its own library specifically meant for reference work during class.

GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP

W.B. Govt. scholarship is recommended every year for the students belonging to S.C/S.T. category and Minority Community. The college also gives concession to deserving students.

FACILITIES

N.S.S.

Admission to N.S.S. is open to all the students of the college. Interested students are advised to contact the N.S.S. programme officers.

REMEDIAL COACHING

Cluny Women's college has been conducting free remedial coaching to the students belonging to S.C/S.T. category, Minority Community and those requiring extra help.

CAREER GUIDANCE

Free coaching is offered to students belonging to S.C/S.T. category, Minority Community and General Category students for various competitive examinations.

CLUNY McNAMARA STUDENTS' RESIDENCE

Hostel accomodation facility is available within the campus for students who are admitted in Cluny Women's College. Students must reserve their seats for the hostel in the **space specified in the Admission Application Form.** A separate Prospectus along with Application Form for Residence accomodation is available at the hostel office and must be submitted to the Sister-in-Charge after getting admission in the College. Information regarding the hostel fee structure is given in the Residence prospectus.

THREE/FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

The Curriculum Framework designed by UGC for implementing NEP 2020 specifies that all Undergraduate (UG) degree programmes are to be for a period of 3 years or for 4 years leading to award of UG Degree or UG Honours Degree.

STRUCTURE OF ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES:

All Academic Programmes offered under NEP shall be stylized in terms of credits. Each course/subject in a given Programme of study shall carry certain number of credits which will be awarded on completion of the said course.

BREAKUPOF CREDITS AND COURSES

Every Undergraduate (UG) programme offered by a College shall conform to the Structure specified by the UGC's Framework, 2023. A student of 3 year UG programme is mandated to complete a minimum of 124 credits and the student of 4 year Honours Degree shall complete 160 credits.

COURSE STRUCTURE

- a. Two semesters, with 43 credits, for exit option with a Certificate.
- b. Four semesters, with 84 credits, for exit option with a Diploma.
- c. Six semesters, with 124 credits, for exit option with a Degree.
- d. Eight semesters, with 160 credits, culminating in a Degree in Honours.
- e. Eight semesters, with 160 credits, culminating in Degree in Honours with Research.

EACH COURSE WILL BE OF 2/3/4 CREDITS (wherever applicable) AND THE MARKS DISTRIBUTION WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Major Course (MAJ) 75 marks each -4 credits.
- 2. Minor Courses (MIN) 75 marks each -4 credits.
- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) 75 marks each 4 credits.
- 4. Inter-disciplinary Courses (IDC) -50 marks each -3 credits.
- 5. Value Added Courses (VAC) 75 marks each 4 credits.
- 6. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) -50 marks each -3 credits.
- 7. Internship / Apprenticeship (IARD) 50 marks each 2 credits.
- 8. Research Project / Dissertation (I A R D) 225 marks each (applicable only if the student chooses to pursue Honours with Research) 12 credits.

EXAMINATION

In the Undergraduate semester system, the examinations will be held in eight parts:

- 1. The First and Second Semester for the first year students.
- 2. The Third and Fourth Semester and Fifth and Sixth Semester for the second and third year students respectively.
- 3. The Seventh and Eighth Semester for the fourth year students.

The Academic Sessions including the examinations for first, third, fifth and seventh semesters are July to December and that for the second, fourth, sixth and eighth semesters are January to June.

A 3 Year undergraduate program has to be completed within a span of 5 year from the year of admission. A 4 Year undergraduate program has to be completed within a span of 7 year from the year of admission.

ATTENDANCE

No student will be allowed to take the end semester written Examination if the student concerned has not attended minimum of 75% of the classes held in the course concerned and also in other curricular components.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (BCA)

A Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) degree is a 4 years undergraduate academic program in the field of computer science and information technology. Cluny Women's College has devised a careful plan for pleasant, diligent and constant work at spiritual, academic and material development of the Staff and Students of the College. Here are some simple instructions to be followed by all students.

- 1. College Class hours are from **9:00 am onwards.**
- 2. Students who have completed classes may not leave the College campus before 2:00 pm. Exceptions always arise, so each student is free to appeal to the authority concerned.
- 3. Free time in College is meant to be used wisely and maturely.
- 4. Students are expected to **use the Library daily** for growth in knowledge and Research.
- 5. a) In the 4/3-year Undergraduate Semester system, the Undergraduate Examinations will be held in eight parts:
 - (i) First & Second Semester for the first year students, The Third & Fourth Semester for the second year students, Fifth & Sixth Semester for the third year students and Seventh & Eighth Semester for the Fourth year students.
 - (ii) The academic sessions including the examinations for first, third, fifth and seventh semesters are July to December and that for second, fourth, sixth and eighth semesters are January to June

b) A candidate to be eligible for appearing in any of the Semesters of UNDER-GRADUATE Examination must have minimum 75% attendance and should appear in all internal assessments.

Award of 05 (five) marks on class attendance shall be given in the following manner:

Attendance of 75% and above but below 80%	- 02 marks
Attendance of 80% and above but below 85%	- 03 marks
Attendance of 85% and above but below 90%	- 04 marks
Attendance of 90% and above	- 05 marks

- 7. **Health Practices:** The College invites student's feedback and also provides them with guidance and counselling
- 8. **Extra-curricular Activities** such as Seminars, Debates, Cultural activities, N.S.S. programmes etc. are conducted from time to time and students are expected to take active participation.
- 9. **Uniform saree** should be worn on special occassions.
- 10. **Use of Mobiles** in the College building and premises is permitted only for study purposes under the supervision of teachers.
- 11. Appropriate rules regarding postings in social media must be strictly observed. If required recourse to legal action may be taken against those who violate this rule.
- 12. Students must compulsorily be present on the first day of opening of the college after vacations and on the last day before commencement of vacations.
