

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

A candidate may apply for BA/BCOM/BCA Honours if only the following conditions are fulfilled:-

- i) 55% in the aggregate or,
- ii) 50% in the aggregate with 60% in subject,
- iii) For SC/ST applicants eligibility criteria is 50% in the aggregate or,
- iv) 45% in the aggregate with 60% in subject,
- v) 55% in the aggregate for students applying for B.C.A. and 5% relaxation for SC and ST Candidates.

Important Note:

- 1. For candidates from Science Stream to apply for B.Com Course passing marks in Mathematics is compulsory.
- 2. Candidates from Arts Streams are not allowed to apply in B.Com.
- 3. Candidates from any stream may apply to BCA.
- 4. Self-attested copies of marks sheets must be attached along with the form. Incomplete form will be rejected.
- 5. Admission of a candidate will be cancelled if any of the statement is found incorrect or incomplete.
- 6. All notice regarding admissions will be displayed in the College Notice Board and also will be available in the College website (www.clunycollege.ac.in)

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission to all courses starts after the publication of the results of the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education. Admission is made strictly on the basis of merit (performance in the last public examination).

N.B.:

- 1. Incomplete forms will be rejected
- 2. The College Authority reserves the right to cancel any application / admission
- 3. The candidate must agree to abide by the rules and code of discipline of the North Bengal University and Cluny Women's College. She must affirm that the information furnished in the filled-in form is true to the best of her knowledge.

REGISTRATION

After admission to the College, a student has to get registered with the University of North Bengal. If the concerned student is from a Board other than the W.B.C.H.S.E., she has to get provisionally registered and should submit the <u>Migration Certificate</u> at the earliest. The College will not be responsible in any case for the cancellation and /or rejection of a student's registration.

FACILITIES

LIBRARY

The college has a library for the use of students and members of the staff.

After admission, a student has to produce her fee receipt to the librarian for collecting the library card within the notified time.

LIBRARY SERVICE

The college library provides the following services to optimize the utilization of the reading materials held in the library collection.

- 1. Reference service
- 2. E-Library for student and teachers for research with inflibnet facility.
- 3. An open access system for the student in the central reading room.
- 4. Display of daily newspapers on the reading desk.
- 5. Provision of using journals and periodicals on requirement. The Library is kept open throughout the year except on public holidays and long vacation.

DEPARTMENT LIBRARY

Each Department has its own library specifically meant for reference work during class.

GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP

W.B. Govt. scholarship is recommended every year for the students belonging to S.C/S.T. category and Minority Community. The college also gives concession to deserving students.

N.S.S.

Admission to N.S.S. is open to all the students of the college. Interested students are advised to contact the N.S.S. programme officers.

REMEDIAL COACHING

Cluny Women's college has been conducting free remedial coaching to the students belonging to S.C/S.T. category and Minority Community.

ENTRY IN SERVICES/CAREER GUIDANCE

Free coaching is offered to students belonging to S.C./S.T. category, Minority Community and General Category students for various competitive examinations.

CLUNY McNAMARA STUDENTS' RESIDENCE

Hostel accommodation facility is available for students who are admitted in Cluny Women's College. Students must reserve their seats for the hostel in the space specified in the Admission Application Form. A separate Prospectus along with Application Form for Residence accommodation is available at the Hostel office and must be submitted to the Sister-in-Charge after getting admission in the College. Information regarding the hostel fee structure is given in the Residence prospectus.

COURSES OF STUDIES

- There shall be two courses of studies leading to B.A/B.COM and B.C.A Degree and each course shall be of six semester's duration. One shall be termed as "B.A/B.COM and B.C.A. Honours Program and the other is "B.A and B.COM. Program".
- The admission to under-Graduate Degree Programs will be governed by the guidelines of the University and the Higher Education Department of Govt. of West Bengal as framed from time to time.
- A candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the Under-Graduate Degree Programs of the University (not more than one) in a particular Academic Session.
- A student will have to study Discipline Specific Core Courses, Foundation courses, Generic Electives courses, Discipline Specific Elective Courses, and Skill Enhancement Coursers as prescribed by the concerned Board of Studies.
- At the time of admission a Honours Program \ Program student shall identify the different courses in which she will concentrate to attain the required credits provided that an Honours program, once chosen, cannot be changed unless the student relinquishes the Course and chooses a different Honours Program / Program Course.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The HONOURS PROGRAM course shall be designed as having 140 credits delivered in six (06) semesters with 1950 marks.

The PROGRAM course shall be designed as having 120 credits delivered in six (06) semesters with 1800 marks.

Each Course shall be of 75 marks each except that AECC1 (ENVS) will be of 100 Marks and AECC 2 (English/MIL, Communication) will be of 50 marks.

At the time of admission, a student will identify an Honours Program (total 140 Credits) or Program course (total 120 Credits) in which she shall concentrate. Apart from the Discipline specific Core course she will have to select Generic Elective courses. She will also have to select Discipline Specific Elective courses, ability Enhancement Core Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses from the provided pool of choices.

OUTLINES OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

- 1. Discipline specific Core Course (DSC): The course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core Course.
- 2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: An Elective course offered under the main discipline/ subject to study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
- 2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An Elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of Courses is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective courses.
- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds : Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- 3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): These courses are based upon the content that leads knowledge enhancement: (1)Environmental Science and (2) English/MIL Communication.
- 3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and /or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and laboratory /hands on training/field work. The prime purpose of these courses is to provide students life—skills in hands—on mode so as increase their employability.
- 4. Practical/Tutorials (one each with every discipline specific core and discipline/ generic Specific Elective course): Practical means Laboratory or field exercises in which the student has to do experiments or other practical work of two hour duration. Tutorial means special instructions based on the Lectures.

CURRICULUM

The subjects and papers for the course shall be recommended by the Board by the Board of Under —Graduate Studies in each respective subject from time to time in accordance with the rules of the University of North Bengal.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSIONS

a) HONOURS PROGRAM COURSE

A Candidate who has obtained – (a) 55% marks in the aggregate or (b) 50% in the aggregate with 60% marks in a subject in the last qualifying Examination will be eligible to apply for Honours Program in that subject. Admission shall however be on merit and availability of seats. Provided that for SC/ST candidates – the minimum marks for eligibility shall be as per Rules of the State Government i.e 5% relaxation on aggregate.

Provided further that in matter of eligibility 54.5% marks or above shall be equal to 55%, 49.5% and above shall be equal to 50% and 59.5% marks or above shall be equal to 60%

b) PROGRAM COURSE

- A student shall be allowed to take admission in the Program Course of B.A. and B.Com if she has passed in at least four (04) subjects with English as compulsory subject in the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other Examination which is recognized by the University as equivalent thereto.
- A candidate shall be allowed to pursue B.A. and B.Com Program Course if she has passed the qualifying Examination in Vocational Stream subjects.
- A candidate pursuing Honours in a subject shall not be allowed to take up the same subject as Generic Elective.
- i. A candidate pursuing Honours in a Language subject will be allowed to take another language subject as Generic Elective
 - ii. A candidate shall be allowed to take up Sociology Honours if she has either sociology or History or Philosophy or Political Science in HS.

- iii. A candidate shall be allowed to take up Education
 Honours passing from any stream in 10+2
 examination.
- iv. A candidate shall be allowed to take up B.Com Honours program / program course if she has studied Science along with Maths in the previous qualifying Examination.
- Migrating students should have their Migration Certificates
- A candidate may be allowed to take up Geography if she has passed in Geography at the qualifying examination with the required percentage of marks.
- Admission to honours courses would be strictly on Merit basis and subject to availability of seats.
- International students should produce their student visa and passport.
- Admission will also be made strictly on the basis of receipt of Original Mark Sheet of the passed candidate of the (10+2) Exams.
- Validity of Students Enrolments/Registration: A candidate (Honours/General Course) shall have to complete each semester examination with 3 (three) consecutive chances including his/her first appearance in the concerned semester examination. If any of the chances mentioned above is not availed of by a candidate within the stipulated period, the chance shall be deemed to have lapsed.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (BCA)

In today's fiercely competitive and modern world, computers have emerged as the next best thing to the human brain. Computers and related technologies have taken the world by storm. Cutting edge technologies are emerging everyday as industrial needs become more and more complex. In such a scenario, students need to be properly equipped with requisite knowledge of the current technologies.

At Cluny Women's College, the B.C.A course provides a Degree from The University of North Bengal and aims to provide a solid knowledge of the computer fundamentals, basic and advanced programming concepts, DBMS and RDBMS application usage, exposure and understanding of latest Networking and internet technologies and concepts of Physics and Numerical Methods.

The course objective is to equip the students to emerge as a complete software professional at the completion of her course. She can either opt to enter the software market or continue with higher studies.

Eligibility Criteria for BACHELOR IN COMPUTER APPLICATION (BCA)

- 1. A clear pass in 10+2 level from any recognized Board with 4 subjects. (English language as compulsory)
- 2. Migrating students should have their Migration Certificates
- 3. 55% marks in the aggregate for students applying for BCA and 5% relaxation for SC and ST candidates.

A STUDENT'S DAILY LIFE AT CLUNY WOMEN'S COLLEGE

Cluny Women's College has devised a careful plan for pleasant, diligent and constant work at spiritual, academic and material development of the Staff and Students of the College. Here are some simple instructions to be followed by all students.

- 1. College Class hours are from **9:00 am onwards.**
- 2. Students who have completed classes may not leave the College campus before 2:00 pm. Exceptions always arise, so each student is free to appeal to the authority concerned.
- 3. Free time in College is meant to be used wisely and maturely.
- 4. Students are expected to **use the Library daily** for growth in knowledge and Research.
- 5. a) In the Semester System, the Under Graduate Examinations will be held in six parts
 - (i) The first and second semester for the first year students and
 - (ii) The Third and Fourth Semester and Fifth and Sixth Semester for the second and third year students respectively. The academic session including the examinations for first, third and fifth semester are July to December and that for second, fourth and sixth semester are January to June.
 - A student will have, at the most, five academic years or ten semesters to complete the course.
 - b) A candidate to be eligible for appearing at any of the Semesters of UNDER-GRADUATE Examination **must** have minimum 75% attendance of lectures delivered.

Award of 05 (five) marks on class attendance shall be given in the following manner:

Attendance of 75% and above but below 80%
Attendance of 80% and above but below 85%
Attendance of 85% and above but below 90%
Attendance of 90% and above

- 02 marks
